

As you may know, the Transportation Security Administration has produced and distributed security awareness materials in the school bus industry since 2003. Our Highway and Motor Carrier division created an Employee Guide to School Bus Security and a laminated driver tip card geared to increase awareness of security issues. Good news, we just received a re-printing of the brochures and tip cards and they are ready for shipment!

If you would like to order either of these two documents (or both) they will be sent free of charge. TSA will be happy to send as many brochures and tip cards as needed per company or school district, etc. We suggest getting enough for each employee and maybe even having some for new hires during the next six months or so.

It is our hope that every school bus driver and school transportation employee will have their own copy of the brochure and tip card. We have already sent out 100,000 brochures to the school bus industry and we now have 300,000 more brochures and 300,000 tip cards to distribute to school bus employees across the nation.
