
## **Portable Fire Extinguishers**

Portable fire extinguishers are often used as the first line of defense against small, incipient fires and are an important protection feature for your business. The following are some basic extinguisher guidelines.

- Fire extinguishers should be selected and distributed based on the type of occupancy and combustible materials present at your business or work location.
- Extinguishers should be positioned so that they are always readily accessible.
- Extinguishers should not be blocked by storage, equipment, or other objects.
- Extinguishers should be properly mounted, and should not protrude into traffic paths.
- Extinguishers should only be used by trained employees. Any employee required to use an extinguisher should be trained on use at the time of assignment and annually thereafter.
- Extinguishers should be inspected monthly by staff to ensure that they are fully charged and operable, and should be tagged annually by a qualified contractor to ensure operating reliability.
- Damaged extinguishers should be removed from service and immediately replaced.
- A K-rated extinguisher should be provided in each commercial cooking area to supplement the wet chemical fire suppression system. Signage should be posted indicating that the extinguisher should be used as a back-up to the suppression system only after the suppression system has been activated.
- If you choose to use an extinguisher, remember PASS.




Pull - Pull the pin.



**Aim** – Aim low, pointing the extinguisher nozzle at the base of the fire.



**Squeeze** – Squeeze the handle to release the extinguisher agent.



**Sweep –** Sweep from side-to-side at the base of the fire.

Evacuate immediately if the fire grows too large in size or you have the slightest doubt about your ability to fight the fire.
